

POLICY NO. 431

LINE EXTENSION FOR SEASONAL SERVICES

I. OBJECTIVE

The PCRPPD will construct proposed extensions for seasonal service and the Applicant or Owner will make a "Contribution in Aid of construction" payable in advance of construction, when the extension exceeds the PCRPPD's allowable investment limits.

II. PROVISIONS

1. The PCRPPD will construct permanent extensions of, or additions to, the PCRPPD's existing overhead lines and facilities when the service to be supplied is for seasonal services such as trailor home, dryers, stock pumps, cabins, etc., when the investment is relatively small.
2. Mobile homes will be classed as trailor homes except when the wheels are removed and the structure is set on a permanent foundation.
3. The PCRPPD will construct proposed overhead extension under this rule entirely at its own expense, provided that the total estimated investment in such extension does not exceed the PCRPPD's "Allowable Investment Limits". The PCRPPD's "Allowable Investment Limits" shall be equal to three (3) times the estimated annual revenue.
4. If the total estimated investment in such overhead extension exceeds the PCRPPD's "Allowable Investment Limits", as provided in paragraph 3 above, the prospective customer shall be required to make a "Contribution in aid of Construction" payable in advance of construction. The total "Contribution in Aid of Construction" shall be equal to the difference between the total estimated investment in proposed extension and the PCRPPD's "Allowable Investment Limit".
5. The total estimated investment required for all proposed extensions shall include the cost of all material, labor and appropriate overheads, up to the point where the PCRPPD's wire attaches to the customer's wire.
6. The customer shall furnish, install and maintain all poles, wire and equipment installed beyond the point of delivery which shall be defined as the point where the PCRPPD's wire attaches to the customer's wire.
7. The consumer and owner shall grant the PCRPPD, without charge, right of way over and on the premises on which the line or service is to be built. The employees of the PCRPPD may enter at reasonable times to repair, maintain or perform any other duties necessary to maintain satisfactory service for the consumer

This policy supersedes and cancels all "Line Extension for Seasonal Service" polices prior to this date.

III. RESPONSIBILITY

The General Manager shall be responsible for the administration of this policy.
